Dear Friends & Family of the Allentown Rescue Mission,

2025 was a historic year for the Allentown Rescue Mission! We celebrated **125 years of serving the local community** by providing urgent needs for men experiencing homelessness and transforming lives through the Gospel message.

In May, the Mission received the “Allentown Angel Award” presented by the Greater Lehigh Valley Chamber of Commerce in recognition of its 125 years of dedicated service.

Additionally, this year, the Mission completed a 22-bed emergency shelter expansion. The renovation, funded by the late Albert Granger, raised shelter capacity 24% to 94 beds and total facility capacity for all three programs to 145 beds. The Clean Team Workforce increased operational productivity by securing a long-term, lower-cost lease for its equipment storage and set a new revenue record with \$1.1 million in sales.

Finally, we are proud to report that, as of 2025, the Mission is 100% exclusively funded by private sources: private donations, matching gifts, donor grants, and bequests with zero government funding. We humbly ask for your continued support so together we can rescue, rehabilitate, and restore men in crisis for the next 125 years!

A Brother, Father, and Veteran who couldn't find his way in life


Paul grew up the youngest of seven children. When he entered high school, his siblings were either in college or working. Paul became a "lone wolf" and "always got into trouble."

Lacking direction, Paul enlisted in the army his senior year. However, even after being discharged and becoming a father, he couldn't pull his life together. "I was living for the day, never looking toward the future."

After decades of odd jobs, hustling, addiction, and living with friends and family to stay off the streets, Paul finally burned all his bridges. With nowhere to go, he entered rehab and then came to the **Allentown Rescue Mission**.

At the Mission, Paul took a sobering look around and realized he couldn't keep traveling down the same road. "I was 59 years old, lost, and I had given up." Until, in the Transformation Program, he felt called by God to "embrace change," and for the first time realized, "I can do this!"


